## **Context**

The 2O22 ADP draws from multi-year programmes/projects in the CIDP 2018-2022 while providing linkage in the transition to CIDP 2023-2027. It also incorporates <u>H.E the Governors Manifesto</u> as well as giving consideration to current and emerging issues including the effects of Pandemics. The document has a provision for amendment to harmonized with CIDP 2023-2027 once finalized.

# **Application**

An ADP prepared in a given financial year (FY) normally serves as a guiding framework in the development and execution of budget in the succeeding financial year. The focus in this case (2022 ADP), is the development & implementation of Narok County Budget for financial year 2023/2024 starting 1<sup>st</sup> July 2023.

# **County Strategic Priorities**

- Promotion of National Values and Principles of Governance
- Creating a conducive environment for business to encourage investment growth and expansion of economic opportunities through <u>Industrialization and Manufacturing</u>
